Resolution To Recognize Revenue and Appropriate Expenditures in the Amount of \$168,000 for the Public Health Emergency Preparedness Grant That Will Support Emergency Preparedness and Response

WHEREAS, with funding currently received through this grant, El Paso County Public Health (EPCPH) Emergency Preparedness leads efforts at EPCPH to prepare for, respond to, and recover from all-hazards incidents or events that pose an imminent or potential threat to the health, medical, and environmental needs of El Paso County residents. EPCPH prepares for vulnerabilities by building public health emergency preparedness capabilities through a continuous preparedness cycle of planning, organizing, training, exercising, and evaluation.; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Emergency Preparedness and Response is a core public health service as defined by 6 CCR 1014-7 and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention provides public health emergency preparedness funding to states to strengthen public health’s ability to respond to a range of public health threats, and the public health emergency preparedness grant is the all-encompassing emergency preparedness contract with Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment for the 2023-2024 year; and

WHEREAS, during an emergency, EPCPH may be activated by Pikes Peak Regional Office of Emergency Management (PPROEM) to serve as the Emergency Support Function-8 (ESF-8) lead where EPCPH is responsible for working closely with health and medical partners to ensure that all ESF-8 functions are properly coordinated to support incident response; and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Preparedness and Response program has received \$168,000 in extended authority funds from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment to be applied to the Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) contract dated July 1st, 2023 to June 30th, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the El Paso County Board of Health does hereby recognize revenue and appropriate expenditures in the amount of \$168,000 to the El Paso County Public Health 2024 budget in the following manner:
