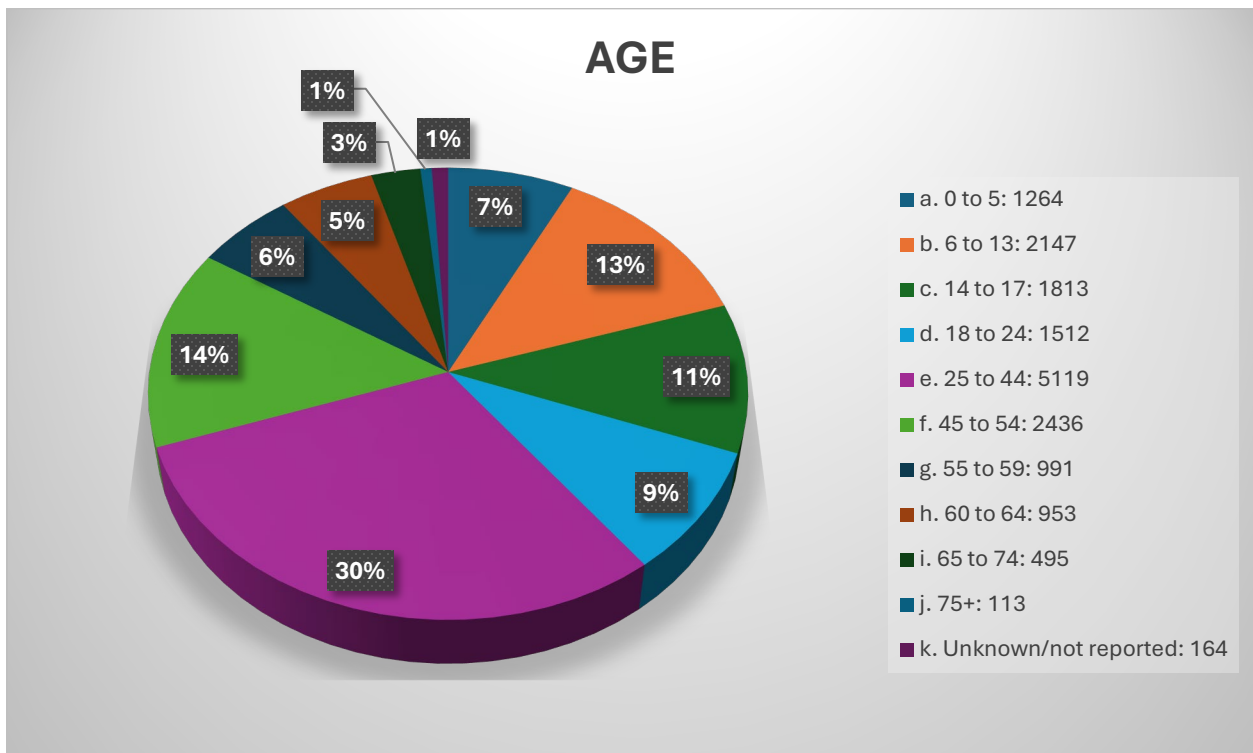
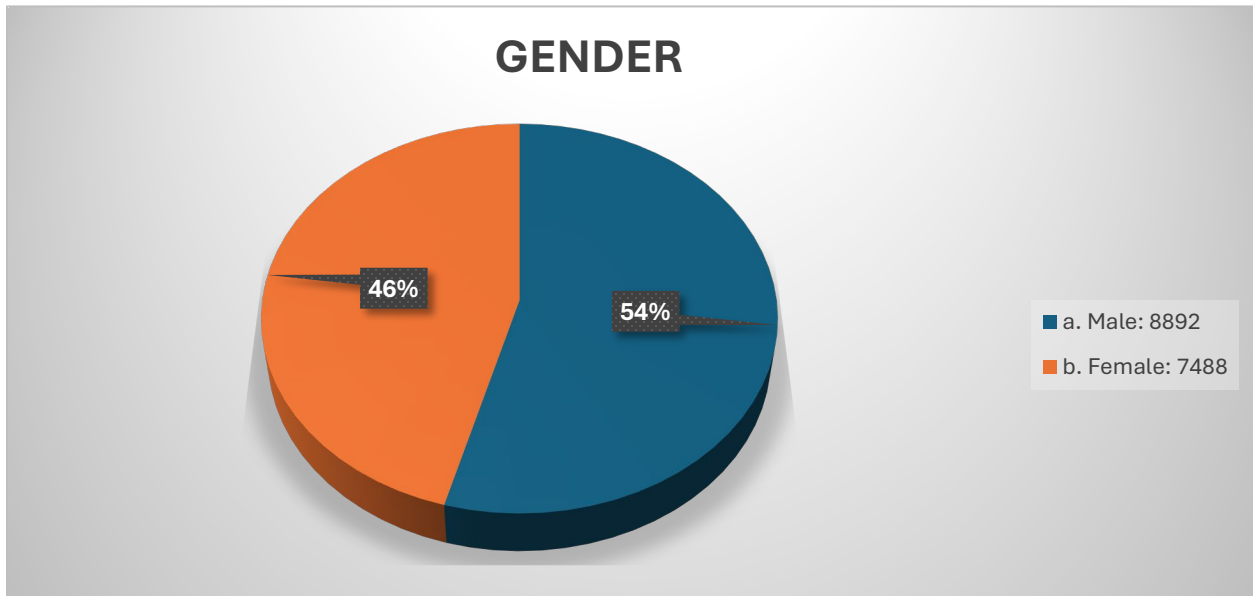
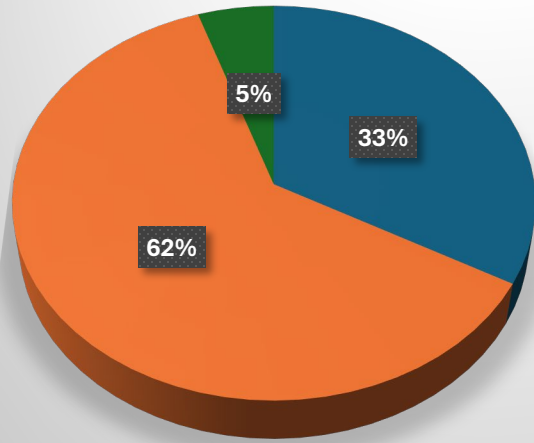


2025 CSBG ANNUAL DATA REPORT

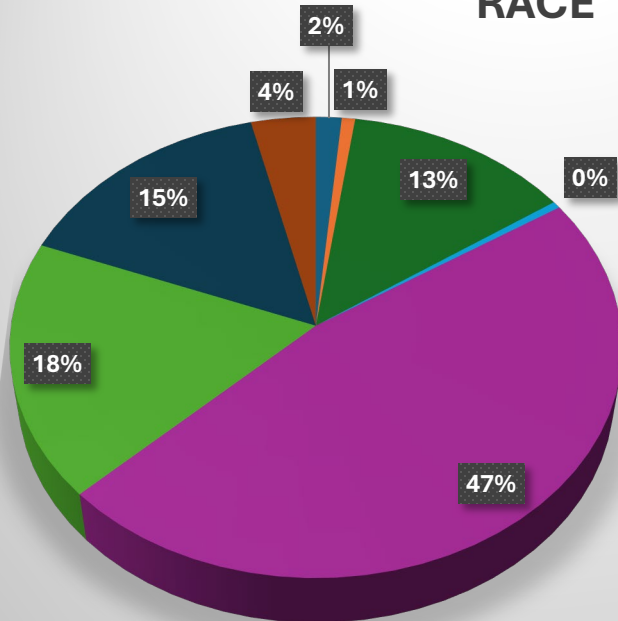

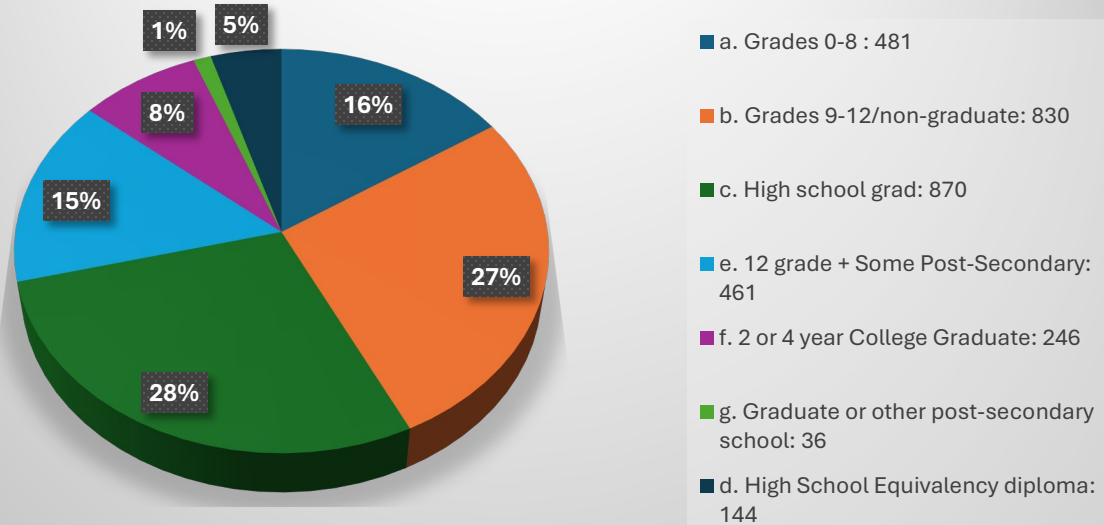

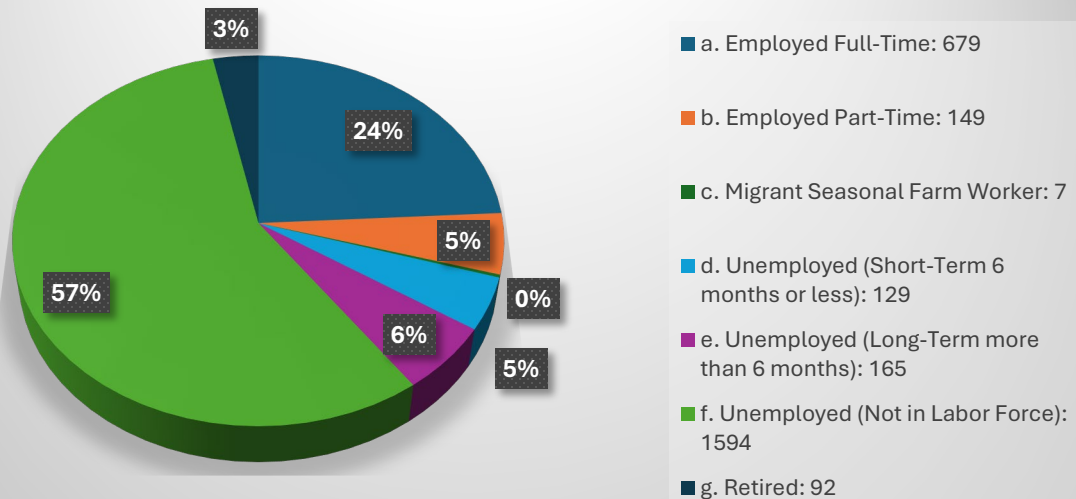

EDUCATION LEVEL (AGES 14+)



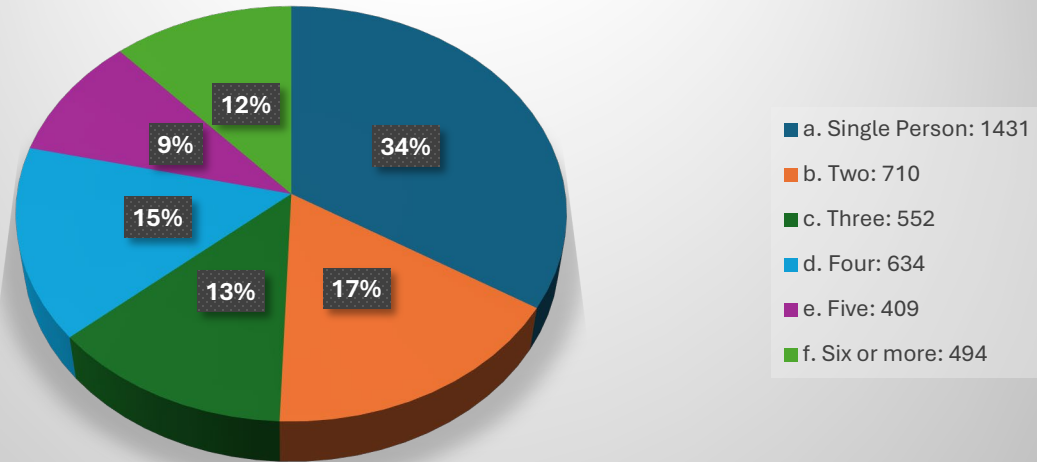

WORK STATUS (18+)



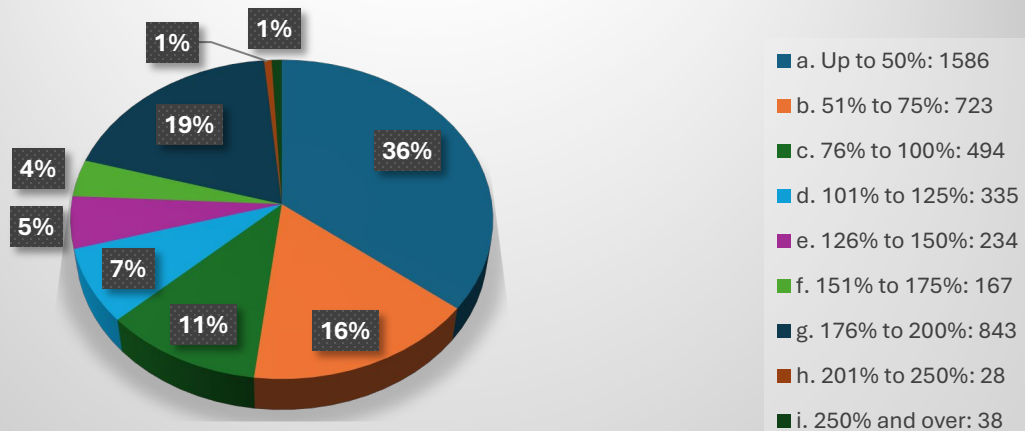

LEVEL OF HOUSEHOLD INCOME: PERCENT OF FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL

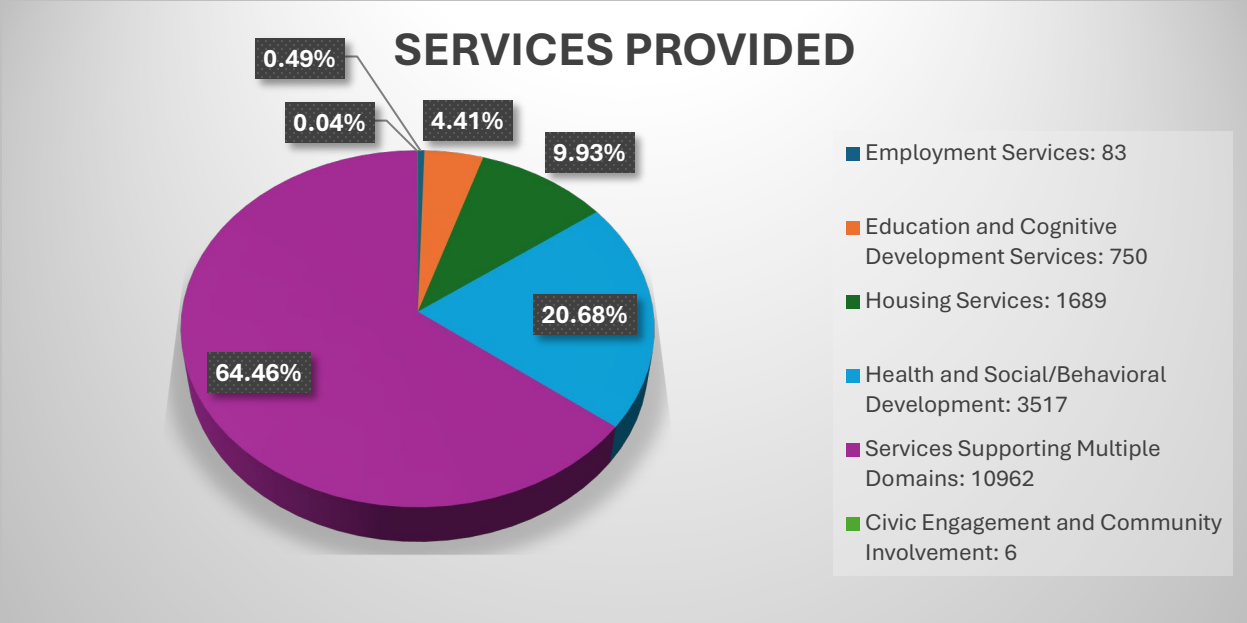
