







Aggravated Assault Trends








Juvenile to Adult Transfer







Victim - William Underwood

Cause of death: multiple gunshot wounds

Two defendants

 Derrick Bernard ordered the murder while serving a DOC sentence


Both defendants convicted at trial

- Murder 1-After Deliberation
- Solicitation to Commit 1st Degree Murder
- Conspiracy to Commit First Degree Murder

Double Homicide - 2024CR753


Victims - Samuel Knopp and Celie Montgomery

• Cause of death: multiple gunshot wounds

Defendant found GUILTY at trial.


- Murder 1-After Deliberation (2 counts)
- Violent Crime Used Weapon
- Violent Crime Cause Death (2 counts)
- Menacing

Sentenced two consecutive Life in Prison without Parole sentences





Sex Assault - 2024CR1989



Victim - LW

Stranger broke into a home and sexually assaulted the victim

Cold case for roughly 20 years

CODIS DNA match led LE to the defendant


Kenneth Hettle convicted at trial

Sex Assault – Overcome Will

Sex Assault – Submit – Force

Sentence: 24 to Life + 12 to Life (Concurrent)





Domestic Violence – 2024CR6257



Victim - GL

Victim was attacked, had a can of soda thrown at her back, was hit in the face, slammed into furniture, and strangled

Defendant tried to convince her not to testify against him at trial

Defendant – Jacob Urbina: GUILTY

Third Degree Assault
Harassment – Strike/Shove/Kick

Sentence: 364 days in jail






