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1. **APPLICABILITY.** These General Terms and Conditions apply, but are not limited, to all bids, proposals, qualifications and quotations (hereinafter referred to as "Offers" and/or "Responses") made to El Paso County (hereinafter referred to as "County") by all prospective suppliers (herein after referred to as "Contractors") in response, but not limited, to Invitations to Bid, Invitations for Bid, Requests for Proposals, Requests for Qualifications, and Requests for Quotations (hereinafter referred to as "Solicitations").

## 2. CONTENTS OF OFFER

- **2.1 General Conditions.** Contractors are required to submit their Offers in accordance with the following expressed conditions:
  - **2.1.1** Contractors shall make all investigations necessary to thoroughly inform themselves regarding the plant and facilities affected by the delivery of materials and equipment as required by the conditions of the Solicitation. No plea of ignorance by the Contractor of conditions that exist or that may hereafter exist as a result of failure to fulfill the requirements of the contract documents will be accepted as the basis for varying the requirements or the compensation to the Contractor.
  - **2.1.2** Contractors are advised that all County contracts are subject to all legal requirements contained in County ordinances, the Contracts and Procurement policies and state and federal statutes. When conflicts between the Solicitation and these legal documents occur, the highest authority will prevail.
  - **2.1.3** Contractors are required to state exactly what they intend to furnish to the County via this Solicitation and must indicate any variances to the terms, conditions, and specifications of this Solicitation no matter how slight. If variations are not stated in the Contractor's Offer, it shall be construed that the Contractor's Offer fully complies with all conditions identified in this Solicitation.
  - **2.1.4** El Paso County intends and expects that the contracting processes of the County and its Contractors provide equal opportunity without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, or any other characteristic protected by law. Accordingly, the Contractor shall not discriminate on any of the foregoing grounds in the performance of the contract.
  - **2.1.5** All Offers and other materials submitted in response to this Solicitation shall become the property of the County and will be a matter of public record. Contractors must identify, in writing, all copyrighted material, trade secrets and/or other proprietary information that it claims are exempt from disclosure under the Open Records Act.

Any Contractor claiming an exemption must identify the specific provision of the Open Records Act that provides an exemption from disclosure for each item that the Contractor claims is not subject to disclosure and must submit an additional bound copy of the Response with each exempt item clearly redacted. Any Contractor claiming an exemption must also state in its Response that the Contractor agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County and its officers and employees from any action brought against the County for its refusal to disclose any purportedly exempt material, trade secrets and other proprietary information to any party making a request therefore.

Any Contractor who fails to include an exemption statement along with the additional redacted copy of the Response shall be deemed to have waived any right to an exemption from disclosure as provided by the Open Records Act.

## 2.2 Clarification and Modifications in Terms and Conditions

- **2.2.1** Where there appear to be variances or conflicts between the General Terms and Conditions, the Special Terms and Conditions and the specifications outlined in this Solicitation, the specifications then the Special Terms and Conditions will prevail.
- **2.2.2** If any Contractor contemplating submitting an Offer under this Solicitation is in doubt as to the true meaning of the specifications, the Contractor must submit a **written request** for clarification to the County's Contracts and Procurement Manager or their designee as outlined in the Special Terms and Conditions. The Contractor submitting the request shall be responsible for ensuring that the request is received by the County's buyer by the date and time listed in the Schedule of Activities for submitting question(s) or as stated in the Special Terms and Conditions.

Any official interpretation of this Solicitation must be made by the County's Contracts and Procurement Manager or their designee. The County shall not be responsible for interpretations offered by other employees of the County.

The County shall issue a written addendum if substantial changes which impact the technical submission of Offers are required. Addenda will be posted on the Rocky Mountain E-Purchasing System web site (http://www.rockymountainbidsystem.com) as well as El Paso County web site (http://www.elpasoco.com). Contractors are responsible for either revisiting one of these websites prior to the due date or contacting the Contracts and Procurement Manager or their designee named on the Cover Sheet of this Solicitation to ensure that they have any addenda which may have been issued after the initial download.

The Contractor shall certify its acknowledgment of the addendum by signing the addendum and returning it with its Offer. In the event of conflict with the original contract documents, addenda shall govern all other contract documents to the extent specified. Subsequent addenda shall govern over prior addenda only to the extent specified.

## 2.3 Prices Contained in Offer--Discounts, Taxes, Collusion

- 2.3.1 Contractors may offer a cash discount for prompt payment. Discounts will be considered in determining the lowest net cost for the evaluation of Offers; discounts for periods of less than twenty days, however, will not be considered in making the award. If the Contractor does not enter a percentage discount, it is hereby understood and agreed that the payment terms shall be net thirty days, effective on the date that the County receives an accurate invoice or accepts the products, whichever is the later date. Payment is deemed to be made on the date of the mailing of the check.
- **2.3.2** Contractors shall not include federal, state, or local excise or sales taxes in prices offered, as the County is exempt from payment of such taxes. Materials purchased directly by the Contractor in conjunction with this contract will, however, be subject to applicable state and local sales taxes. These taxes shall be borne by the contractor. Under no circumstances shall Contractor be authorized to use the County's tax exemption number in acquiring such materials.
- **2.3.3** The Contractor, by affixing its signature to this Solicitation, certifies that its Offer is made without previous understanding, agreement, or connection either with any persons, firms or corporations making an Offer for the same items, services, or with the County. The Contractor also certifies that its Offer is in all respects fair, without outside control, collusion, fraud, or otherwise illegal action. To ensure integrity of the County's public procurement process, all Contractors are hereby placed on notice that any and all Contractors who falsify the certifications required in conjunction with this section will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.

## 3. PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF OFFER

## 3.1 Preparation

- **3.1.1** El Paso County will not be responsible for any expenses incurred by any Contractor in preparing and submitting its offer.
- **3.1.2** The Offer must be typed or legibly printed in ink. The use of erasable ink is not permitted. All corrections made by the Contractor must be initialed **in blue ink** by the authorized agent of the Contractor.
- **3.1.3** Offers must contain, in blue ink, a manual signature of an authorized agent of the Contractor or a verifiable electronic signature in the space provided on the Solicitation Cover Sheet. The original Cover Sheet of this Solicitation must be included in all Offers. If the Contractor's authorized agent fails to sign and return the original Cover Sheet of the Solicitation, its Offer shall be invalid and shall not be considered.
- **3.1.4** Prices shall be provided by the Contractor on the Solicitation's Pricing Form when required in conjunction with the prescribed method of award and shall be for the unit of measure requested. Prices that are not in accordance with the measurements and descriptions requested shall be considered non-responsive and shall not be considered. Where there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the extension of prices, the unit price shall prevail.
- **3.1.5** Alternate Offers will not be considered unless expressly permitted in the Specification's Special Terms and Conditions.
- **3.1.6** The accuracy of the Offer is the sole responsibility of the Contractor. No changes in the Offer shall be allowed after the date and time that the Offers are due.

## 3.2 Submission

- **3.2.1** The Offer shall be submitted via the Rocky Mountain E-Purchasing System with the Contractor's name, the RFP Number, and the RFP Title. When required in conjunction with the prescribed method of award, the County's Pricing Form must be used when the Contractor is submitting its Offer. The Contractor shall not alter this form (e.g., add or modify categories for posting prices offered) unless expressly permitted in an addendum duly issued by the County. No other form shall be accepted.
- **3.2.2** Offers submitted via facsimile machines, mail, or email will not be accepted unless expressly permitted in the solicitation.
- **3.2.3** Contractors which qualify their Offers by requiring alternate contractual terms and conditions as a stipulation for contract award must include such alternate terms and conditions in their Offers. The County reserves the right to declare Contractors' Offers as non-responsive if any of these alternate terms and conditions are in conflict with the County's terms and conditions, or if they are not in the best interests of the County.
- **3.3** Late Offers. Offers received after the date and time set for the opening will not be authorized to enter into the electronic lockbox and will be deemed as non-responsive.

## 4. MODIFICATION OR WITHDRAWAL OF OFFERS

**4.1. Modifications to Offers.** Offers may only be modified in the form of a written notice on company letterhead and must be received prior to the time and date set for the Offers to be opened. Each modification submitted to the County's Contracts and Procurement Division must have the Contractor's name and return address and the applicable Solicitation number and title clearly marked on the face of the envelope. If more than one modification is submitted, the modification

bearing the latest date of receipt by the County's Contracts and Procurement Division will be considered the valid modification.

## 4.2. Withdrawal of Offers

- **4.2.1** Offers may be withdrawn prior to the time and date set for the opening. Such requests must be made in writing on company letterhead.
- **4.2.2** In accordance with the Uniform Commercial Code, Offers may not be withdrawn after the time and date set for the opening for a period of ninety calendar days after the opening. If an Offer is withdrawn by the Contractor during this ninety-day period, the County may, at its option, suspend the Contractor from the bid list and may not accept any Offer from the Contractor for a six-month period following the withdrawal.

## 5. **REJECTION OF OFFERS**

- 5.1. Rejection of Offers. The County may, at its sole and absolute discretion:
  - 5.1.1 Reject any and all, or parts of any or all, Offers submitted by prospective Contractors;
  - **5.1.2** Re-advertise this Solicitation;
  - **5.1.3** Postpone or cancel the process;
  - 5.1.4 Waive any irregularities in the Offers received in conjunction with this Solicitation; and/or
  - **5.1.5** Determine the criteria and process whereby Offers are evaluated and awarded. No damages shall be recoverable by any challenger as a result of these determinations or decisions by the County.
- **5.2 Rejection of a Particular Offer.** The County may reject an offer under any of the following conditions:
  - **5.2.1** The Contractor misstates or conceals any material fact in its Offer;
  - **5.2.2** The Contractor's Offer does not strictly conform to the law or the requirements of the Solicitation;
  - **5.2.3** The Offer expressly requires or implies a conditional award that conflicts with the method of award stipulated in the Solicitation's Special Terms and Conditions and/or specifications;
  - **5.2.4** The Offer does not include documents, including, but not limited to, certificates, licenses, and/or samples, which are required for submission with the Offer in conjunction with the Solicitation's Special Terms and Conditions and/or specifications; or
  - **5.2.5** The Offer has not been executed by the Contractor through an authorized signature on the Specification's Cover Sheet.

## 5.3 Elimination from Consideration

**5.3.1** To ensure fair consideration for all Contractors, the County prohibits communication initiated by a Contractor or on a Contractor's behalf regarding the Solicitation to or with any County official or employee during the submission process, except as expressly set forth in this Solicitation. In addition, the County prohibits communications initiated by a Contractor or on a Contractor's behalf to or with any County official or employee evaluating or considering the solicitation prior to the time an award decision has been made. Prohibited communications initiated by a Contractor shall be grounds for eliminating the offending Contractor from consideration for award.

- **5.3.2** An Offer may not be accepted from, nor any contract be awarded to, any person or firm which is in arrears to the County upon any debt or contract or which is a defaulter as surety or otherwise upon any obligation to the County.
- **5.3.3** An Offer may not be accepted from, nor any contract awarded to, any person or firm which has failed to perform faithfully any previous contract with the County, state, or federal government, for a minimum period of three years after this previous contract was terminated for cause.
- 6. AWARD OF CONTRACT. El Paso County and the successful Contractor shall execute the County's Professional Service Agreement (see Attachment B) to consummate a contract between the parties. This Solicitation and the Contractor's Offer shall be attached and incorporated as part of that contract.

## 7. CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS

- 7.1 Local, State and Federal Compliance Requirements. Successful Contractors shall be familiar and comply with all local, state, and federal directives, ordinances, rules, orders, and laws applicable to, and affected by, this contract including, but not limited to, Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) regulations, Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA), and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
- **7.2 Disposition.** The Contractor shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet, or otherwise dispose of this contract, including any or all of its right, title or interest therein, or its power to execute such contract to any person, company, or corporation, without prior written consent of the County.

## 7.3 Employees.

- **7.3.1** All employees of the Contractor shall be considered to be, at all times, employees of the Contractor, under its sole direction, and not employees or agents of the County. The County may require the Contractor to remove an employee it deems careless, incompetent, insubordinate or otherwise objectionable, and whose continued employment on County property is not in the best interest of the County. In accordance with the County's policy regarding the use of tobacco products, no employee of the Contractor shall be permitted to use tobacco products when performing work on County property.
- **7.3.2** Contractors providing services to El Paso County shall comply with all State and Local requirements concerning Workers Without Authorization as required by C.R.S. § 8-17.5-102 and public contracts for service.
- 7.4 Workers' Compensation Insurance. Each contractor and subcontractor shall maintain at his own expense until completion of his work and acceptance thereof by the County, Workers' Compensation Insurance, including occupational disease provisions, covering the obligations of the contractor or subcontractor in accordance with the provisions of the laws of the State of Colorado. The contractor shall furnish the County with a certificate giving evidence that he is covered by the Workers' Compensation Insurance herein required, each certificate specifically stating that such insurance includes occupational disease provisions and provisions preventing cancellation without ten days' prior notice to the County in writing.
- 7.5 Delivery. Prices, quotes, and deliveries are to be FOB destination, freight prepaid, and shall require inside delivery unless otherwise specified in the Solicitation's Special Terms and Conditions. Title and risk of loss shall pass to the County upon inspection and acceptance by the County at its designated point of delivery, unless otherwise specified in the Special Terms and Conditions. In the event that the Contractor defaults on its contract or the contract is terminated for cause due to performance, the County reserves the right to re-procure the materials or services from the next lowest Contractor or from other sources during the remaining term of the terminated/defaulted contract. Under this arrangement, the County shall charge the Contractor, as well as any costs associated with the re-solicitation effort.

- **7.6** Material or Service Priced Incorrectly. As part of any award resulting from this process, Contractor(s) will discount all transactions as agreed. In the event the County discovers, through its contract monitoring process or formal audit process, that material or service was priced incorrectly, Contractor(s) agree to promptly refund all overpayments and to pay all reasonable audit expenses incurred as a result of the non-compliance.
- 8. CONTRACT MODIFICATIONS. Terms and conditions may be added, modified, and deleted upon mutual agreement between the County and the Contractor provided that such terms and conditions remain within the scope and original intent of the Solicitation. Said terms and conditions may include, but are not limited to, additions or deletions of service levels and/or commodities and/or increases or decreases in the time limits for an existing contract. Any and all modifications must be expressed in writing through a Memorandum of Understanding and executed by authorized agents of the County and the Contractor prior to the enactment of such modifications.

## 9. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

- **9.1** Failure to perform. The County may, by written notice to the successful Contractor, terminate the contract if the Contractor has been found to have failed to perform its service in a manner satisfactory to the County as per specifications, including delivery as specified. The date of termination shall be stated in the notice. The County shall be the sole judge of non-performance.
- **9.2 Reasons other than cause.** The County may cancel the contract upon thirty days written notice for reason other than cause. This may include the County's inability to continue with the contract due to the elimination or reduction of funding.



1. ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION OF OFFERS: El Paso County will only accept electronic bid Responses submitted through the Rocky Mountain E-Purchasing system. A Submittal Log will be posted after the Opening and after the County has had an opportunity to review and verify the submittals offered to the County.

The original Offer must be received before the due date and time through an electronic package transmitted through the Rocky Mountain E-Purchasing system. The Contractor is responsible for ensuring its Response is posted by the due date and time outlined in the solicitation document.

If the submittal arrives late, it will not be included in the electronic lockbox.

- 3. PURPOSE OF SOLICITATION: El Paso County is issuing this Solicitation for the purpose of entering into a contract for professional services as specified herein from a Contractor(s) that will provide prompt and efficient service to the County for Homestead Ranch Regional Park Forestry Maintenance. Although this Solicitation specifies an exact location and timeline for these services to be completed, it is understood and agreed that the County may, during the term of the contract, request additional services be performed by the successful Contractor(s) at other locations within El Paso County. This option, if exercised, is the prerogative of the County and shall be honored by the Contractor(s) throughout the contract period. No guarantees are made that additional services will be requested.
- 4. TERM OF CONTRACT: The awarded contract shall commence on June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 and shall remain in effect through August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022. Notwithstanding, it shall be understood and agreed that any required warranty period which exceeds this term shall remain in full force for the duration of
- 5. RESPONSE TO QUESTIONS: Questions which arise during the Response preparation period regarding issues around this Solicitation, purchasing and/or award should be directed electronically, via the Rocky Mountain E-Purchasing system, to Kendall Bik, Procurement Specialist, Contracts and Procurement Division, El Paso County. The Contractor submitting the question(s) shall be responsible for ensuring that the question(s) is received by the date and time listed above in the schedule of activities for submitting the question(s).

Any official interpretation of this Solicitation must be made by an agent of the County's Contracts and Procurement Division who is authorized to act on behalf of the County. The County shall not be responsible for interpretations offered by employees of the County who are not agents of the County's Contracts and Procurement Division.

- 6. SOLICITATION DOCUMENTS: EI Paso County officially distributes solicitation documents through the Rocky Mountain E-Purchasing System and the County's website. Copies of solicitations obtained from any other source are <u>not</u> considered official copies. Only those contractors who obtain solicitation documents from the Rocky Mountain E-Purchasing System or El Paso County website will be in receipt of officially posted and relevant information regarding solicitations issued by El Paso County. The County cannot be held responsible for incorrect information, nor can it attest to the accuracy of information, found on websites other than the Rocky Mountain E-Purchasing System or the County's website.
- 7. PRE-PROPOSAL CONFERENCE AND SITE WALK IS MANDATORY: A mandatory pre-proposal site walk will be conducted at Homestead Ranch Regional Park, 16444 Gollihar Rd, 80831 at 9:00 a.m. on April 21, 2022, to discuss the Specifications. Meet at park pavilion. A representative of the Contractor must attend this mandatory site walk in order to qualify to respond to this Solicitation. Contractors who fail to arrive at the pre-proposal site walk within 15 minutes of the scheduled starting time shall be considered non-responsive and ineligible for award. It is hereby agreed and understood that the site walk of Homestead Area 1 is approximately 38 acres and Contractors should schedule their time accordingly.
- 8. METHOD OF AWARD BEST EVALUATIVE SCORE BASED ON WRITTEN RESPONSE: It is the intent of the County to award this Solicitation to the Contractor who receives the highest score when the Responses submitted by interested Contractors are reviewed by the County's Response Evaluation Committee. For this Solicitation, the Evaluation Committee will score Responses based on the following criteria listed in no order of importance:
  - a. Schedule
  - b. Forestry Work Plan
  - c. Project Cost
  - d. Qualifications

Evaluation criteria, other than costs, are evaluated first. After rating the written Responses, costs are then considered against trade-offs such as satisfaction of requirements in the Solicitation, qualifications and financial condition of the Contractor, risk, and incentives.

If it is in the best interest of the County, the Evaluation Committee may invite a limited number of Contractors who received the highest scores during the written phase to provide an oral presentation and discussion. The number of Contractors who may be invited to participate in this discussion will be determined by the Evaluation Committee after the written Responses have been scored.

The County reserves the right to conduct negotiations with Contractors and to accept revisions of Responses. During this negotiation period, the County will not disclose any information derived from Responses submitted, or from discussions with other Contractors. Once an award is made, the Solicitation file and the Responses contained therein are in the public record.

- **9. POST INTENT TO AWARD MEETING:** The Contractor may be required to attend a post intent to award meeting with the County to discuss the terms and conditions of the contract. This meeting will be coordinated by the Contracts and Procurement Division once a Notice of Intent to Award has been issued.
- **10. DEBRIEFING:** Offeror(s) not selected for award may request a debriefing on the selection process as well as discussion of the strengths and weaknesses of their firm's proposal upon the Final Notice of Award being posted on the Rocky Mountain E-Purchasing website.

A debriefing may be scheduled by contacting the Procurement Specialist listed on the Cover Sheet of this Solicitation once the Final Notice of Award has been posted.

- 11. PROOF OF REGISTRATION WITH THE COLORADO SECRETARY OF STATE: Successful contractors that are corporations or limited liability companies will be required to furnish a Certificate of Good Standing from the Colorado Secretary of State's Office, as proof that they are properly registered to do business in the State of Colorado, prior to finalization of award.
- 12. LOBBYING PROHIBITED: Contractors are prohibited from directly or indirectly communicating with members of the Board of County Commissioners regarding their qualifications or any other matter related to the eventual award of a contract for the goods and/or services requested in this Solicitation. Contractors are prohibited from contacting County employees or evaluation committee members regarding their qualifications or the award of a contract unless in response to an inquiry from an employee or committee member as part of the formal evaluation process outlined in the Solicitation. Any violation of these provisions will result in the Contractor's immediate disqualification from the selection process.
- 13. CONFLICTS WITHIN THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS: In the event that conflicts exist within the Contract Documents, the policies stated in the following paragraphs shall govern: A. Addenda shall supersede all other Contract Documents to the extent specified. Subsequent addenda shall supersede prior addenda only to the extent specified. B. Drawings and Specifications are intended to agree and be mutually explanatory and shall be accepted and used as a whole and not separately. Should any item be omitted from either the drawings or Specifications as specified, it shall be implied that such omissions are contained in both the drawings and the Specifications as necessary for the proper construction of the work herein specified. Should any error or disagreement between the Specifications and drawings exist or appear to exist, the Contractor shall not avail itself of such manifestly unintentional error or omission but must have same explained or adjusted by the County's project manager before proceeding with the work in question.
- 14. LOCATION OF WORK: The work described in this Solicitation shall be performed at Homestead Ranch Regional Park, 16444 Gollihar Rd, 80831. Homestead Area 1, 37.6 Acres, as described in project aerial maps attached (Exhibit B). Work area will be marked with orange flagging.
- 15. LIMITATION OF OPERATIONS DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS: No work shall be performed during normal business hours which are 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. except in those cases where such work is necessary for the proper care and protection of the work already performed, and only in those cases where permission to do such work is secured from the County's Project Manager. No overtime work shall be started without prior approval of the County's Project Manager or his/her designated representative.
- **16. PROJECT MANAGER SHALL BE SUPPLIED BY CONTRACTOR:** The successful Contractor shall employ a competent project manager who shall be the primary representative for the Contractor and all communications given to, and all decisions made by, the superintendent shall be binding to the Contractor. Notwithstanding, the project manager shall be considered to be, at all times, an employee of the Contractor under its sole direction and not an employee or agent of the County.
- **17. CURRENT CERTIFICATION PREFERRED:** It is preferred that the awarded Contractor be an ISA Certified Arborist, but not required. Contractor shall enclose a current copy, if available, of their certification with their response.
- 18. ELIGIBILITY OF CONTRACTORS MUST BE ENGAGED IN SUPPLYING PRODUCTS OR SERVICES RENDERED: Pre-award inspection of the Contractor's facility may be made prior to award of the contract. Solicitations will only be considered from firms which have been engaged in the business of manufacturing or distributing the goods and/or performing services as described in this Solicitation for a minimum period of five (5) years prior to the date of this Solicitation. The Contractors must be able to produce evidence that they have an established satisfactory record of performance for a reasonable period of time and have sufficient financial support, equipment and organization to ensure that they can satisfactorily execute the services if awarded a contract. The term <u>equipment and organization</u> as used herein shall be construed to mean a fully equipped and well-established company in line with the best business practices in the industry and as determined by the

proper authorities of the County. The County reserves the right, before awarding the contract, to require a Contractor to submit such evidence of its qualifications as it may deem necessary and may consider any evidence available to it (including, but not limited to, the financial, technical and other qualifications and abilities of the Contractor, including past performance and experience with the County) in making the award in the best interest of the County.

- 19. PAST PERFORMANCE: The County may evaluate Past Performance with El Paso County or another entity and/or make such investigations as deemed necessary to determine the ability of the Contractor to perform work outlined in this solicitation. If the County has terminated a contract with the Contractor within the past five (5) years, the Contractor may be asked to furnish information for this investigation as the County requests. Such information includes but not limited to: current/past company references, current licensing information, history of the firm on assessments of liquidated damages, contracts cancelled prior to completion and/or lawsuits and/or pending lawsuits against the firm and/or its principals. The County reserves the right to reject any Response if the evidence submitted by, or investigation of, such Contractor fails to satisfy the County that such Contractor is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the Solicitation and to complete the work contemplated herein. Conditional Responses will not be accepted.
- **20. CONSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT NOT ALLOWED:** Responses will only be considered from firms which are directly engaged in the business of performing the services described in this Solicitation. Accordingly, no part of this contract can be consigned to another contractor.
- 21. SUB-CONTRACTORS OF WORK SHALL BE IDENTIFIED: As part of its Response, the Contractor shall be required to identify any and all sub-contractors that will be used in the performance of the contract resulting from this Solicitation. The Contractor shall also identify the capabilities, experience, and portion of the work to be performed by the sub-contractor(s). The competency of the sub-contractor(s) with respect to skill, responsibility and business standing shall be considered by the County when making the award in the best interest of the County.
- 22. LABOR, MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT TO BE SUPPLIED BY THE CONTRACTOR: Unless otherwise provided in this Solicitation, the Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, and equipment necessary for satisfactory contract performance. When not specifically identified in this Solicitation, such materials and equipment shall be of a suitable type and grade for the intended purpose. All materials, workmanship, and equipment shall be subject to the inspection and approval of the County's Project Manager.
- **23. DEFICIENCIES IN WORK TO BE CORRECTED BY CONTRACTOR:** The successful Contractor shall promptly correct all deficiencies in service and/or any service that fails to conform to the Contract Documents. All corrections shall be made immediately after such deficiencies and/or non-conformances are verbally reported to the Contractor by the County's Project Manager. The Contractor shall bear all costs of correcting such rejected services. If the Contractor fails to correct the service within the period specified in this Solicitation, the County reserves the right to place the Contractor in default of its contractual obligations, obtain the services of another contractor and charge the Contractor for these costs, either through a deduction from the final payment over to the Contractor or through invoicing.
- 24. ADDITIONAL SERVICES MAY BE PURCHASED DURING CONTRACT PERIOD: Although this Solicitation specifies an exact number of locations where services are to be performed for the County, it is understood and agreed that the County may, during the term of the awarded contract, request additional services for the same or other locations from the successful Contractor. This option, if exercised, is the prerogative of the County and shall be honored by the Contractor as a condition of contract award.
- **25. SALES TAX:** The County is exempt from paying State or Local Sales Taxes. Contractors should be aware of CONTRACTOR APPLICATION FOR EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE Pursuant to Statute Section 39-26.708(1)(a)(XIX) sales tax exemption for construction and building materials. State tax I.D. # 09-803308-0000, Federal tax I.D. # 84-6000764.

- 26. METHOD OF PAYMENT MONTHLY INVOICES: The successful Contractor(s) shall submit monthly invoices by the tenth day of each month. These invoices shall be submitted to the County's Project Manager. The invoice shall reflect the appropriate Purchase Order number, the service location(s) and the type of service provided to the County in the prior month.
- 27. ACCIDENT PREVENTION: The Contractor shall be required to take safety precautions in an effort to protect persons and County property. All contractors and sub-contractors shall conform to all OSHA, State and County regulations while performing under the terms and conditions of the awarded contract. Any fines levied by the above-mentioned authorities because of inadequate compliance with these requirements shall be borne solely by the Contractor which is responsible for same. Barricades shall be provided by the Contractor when work is performed in areas traversed by persons or when deemed necessary by the County's Project Manager.
- **28. PROTECTION OF PROPERTY:** All existing structures, utilities, services, roads, trees, shrubbery, etc. located on County property shall be protected against damage or interrupted services at all times by the Contractor during the term of the awarded contract. The Contractor shall be held responsible for repairing or replacing any and all property which is damaged by reason of the Contractor's operation on the property to the satisfaction of the County.
- **29. CLEAN UP AFTER PROJECT IS COMPLETED:** All unusable materials and debris shall be removed from the County premises. At completion, the successful Contractor shall thoroughly clean up all areas where work has been involved as mutually agreed with the County's Project Manager.
- **30. TOXIC SUBSTANCES:** The Federal <u>'Right to Know'</u> Regulations implemented by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requires employers to inform their employees of any toxic substances in the workplace to which they may be exposed, and to provide training in safe handling practices and emergency procedures. It also requires notification to local fire departments of the location and characteristics of all toxic substances regularly present in the workplace. Accordingly, all Responses must be accompanied by Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS), provided, however, that the low Vendor may be given the opportunity to submit these Sheets to the County during the Response evaluation period in the best interest of the County.

## 31. INSURANCE:

- A. The Contractor agrees to procure and maintain, during the life of this Agreement, a policy, or policies of insurance against all liability, claims, demands and other obligations assumed by the Contractor, pursuant to Attachment A. Such insurance shall be in addition to any other insurance requirements imposed by this Agreement or by law. The Contractor shall not be relieved of any liability, claims, demands or other obligations assumed pursuant to Attachment A, by reason of its failure to procure or maintain, during the life of this Agreement, insurance in sufficient amounts, durations, or types.
- B. The Contractor shall procure and maintain, during the life of this Agreement, for itself and any subcontractors, the minimum insurance coverages listed below. Such coverages shall be procured and maintained with forms and insurers acceptable to the County. All coverages shall be continuously maintained to cover all liability, claims, demands and other obligations assumed by the Contractor, pursuant to Attachment A. In the case of a claims-made policy, the necessary retroactive dates and extended reporting periods shall be procured to maintain such continuous coverage. Notwithstanding the foregoing, when the Contractor requires a subcontractor to obtain insurance coverage, the types and minimum limits of this coverage may be different than those required, as stated herein for the Contractor.
  - a. The certificate of insurance provided by the Contractor shall be completed by the Contractor's insurance agent as evidence that policies providing the required coverages, conditions and minimum limits are in full force and effect and shall be reviewed and approved by the County prior to commencement of the Agreement. No other form of certificate shall be used. The certificate shall identify this Agreement and the coverages afforded under the policies. The certificate of insurance must be on file with the County two (2) weeks prior to commencement of the Agreement. The completed certificate of insurance shall be named and sent to:

- b. It is the affirmative obligation of the Contractor to notify the County's Contract Specialist, as provided in this Agreement, including e-mailing (PURCOI@elpasoco.com) a copy of the notice to the Contracts and Procurement Division, within two (2) business days of the cancellation or substantive change to any insurance policy required under this Agreement, and failure to do so shall constitute a breach of this Agreement.
- c. Failure on the part of the Contractor to procure or maintain policies providing the required coverages, conditions and minimum limits shall constitute a material breach of contract upon which the County may immediately terminate this Agreement or, at its discretion, the County may procure or renew any such policy or any extended reporting period thereto and may pay any and all premiums in connection therewith, and all monies so paid by the County shall be repaid by Contractor to the County upon demand, or the County may offset the cost of the premiums against any monies due to Contractor from the County.
- d. The County reserves the right to request and receive a certified copy of any policy and any endorsement thereto.
- e. The parties hereto understand and agree that the County, its officers and employees, are relying on and do not waive or intend to waive by any provision of this Agreement the monetary limitations (presently Three Hundred Eighty-Seven Thousand Dollars (\$387,000) per person, and One Million Ninety-Three Thousand Dollars (\$1,093,000) per occurrence), which amounts shall be adjusted by an amount reflecting the percentage change over a four-year period in the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Consumer Price Index for Denver-Boulder-Greeley, All Items, All Urban Consumers, or its successor index, or any other rights, immunities and protections provided by the Colorado Governmental Immunity Act, C.R.S. § 24-10-101, *et seq.*, as from time to time amended, or otherwise available to the County, its officers or employees.
- **32. INDEMNIFICATION:** Indemnification General. The Contractor shall, to the fullest extent permitted by law, defend, indemnify and hold harmless the County, Board of County Commissioners, officials, officers, directors, and employees, from and against all liability, claims, demands, suits, actions or proceedings of any kind that are not the result of or directly related to the performance of professional services, including, without limitation, claims arising from bodily injury, personal injury, sickness, disease, death, property loss or damage, which arise out of or are in any manner connected with this Agreement, including workers' compensation claims, in any way resulting from or arising from the services rendered by the Contractor, its employees, agents or subcontractors, or others for whom the Contractor is legally liable, under this Agreement; provided, however, that the Contractor need not indemnify or save harmless the County Board of County Commissioners, its officers, agents and employees, from damages resulting from the negligence of the County's Board of County Commissioners, officials, officers, directors, agents, and their insurers, and employees. The County cannot and by this Agreement does not agree to indemnify, hold harmless, exonerate or assume the defense of the Contractor or any other person or entity whatsoever, for any purpose whatsoever.

Indemnification for Professional Services. The Contractor shall, to the fullest extent permitted by law, indemnify and hold harmless the County, Board of County Commissioners, and any of its officials, officers, directors, agents, and their insurers, and employees, from and against damages, liability, losses, costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, but only to the extent caused by or arising out of the negligent acts, errors or omissions of the Contractor, its employees, agents or subcontractors, or others for whom the Contractor is legally liable, in the performance of professional services under this Agreement. The Contractor is not obligated to indemnify or hold harmless the County for the negligent acts of the County, Board of County Commissioners, or any of its officials, officers, directors, agents, and employees.

<u>Indemnification – Costs</u>. The Contractor shall, to the extent provided by law, investigate, handle, respond to, and provide defense for and defend against, any such liability, claims or demands at the sole expense of the Contractor or, at the option of the County, agrees to pay the County or reimburse the County for the defense costs incurred by the County in connection with any such liability, claims or demands. The Contractor shall, to the extent provided by law, bear all other costs and expenses related thereto, including court costs and attorney fees, whether or not any such liability, claims or demands alleged are groundless, false or fraudulent. If it is determined by the final judgment of a court of any competent jurisdiction that such injury, loss or damage was caused in whole or in part by the act, omission or other fault of the County, Board of County Commissioners, officials, officers, directors, agents and employees, the County shall reimburse the County Commissioners, officials, officers, directors, agents and employees.

- **33. FEDERAL STANDARDS COMPLIANCE:** All services to be purchased in conjunction with this Solicitation shall be in accordance with all governmental standards to include, but not be limited to, those issued by the Office of Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), the National Institute of Occupational Safety Hazards (NIOSH), and the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA).
- 34. VALUE ADDED PROPOSALS ENCOURAGED: El Paso County is interested in maximizing the impact of expenditures as it relates to achieving additional value that would further benefit the County and its operations, as well as, its community of citizens and their taxed base funding. As such, Contractors are encouraged to consider, develop, and propose value added concepts, programs, components that would further enhance the services/acquisition represented in this solicitation request. Suggestions for value added components include, but may not be limited to: Incentive and rebate programs, recommendations for enhancements, additional items to be provided to the County, etc.
- **35. NON-APPROPRIATION.** Pursuant to C.R.S.§ 29-1-110, as amended, the financial obligations of the County as set forth herein after the current fiscal year are contingent upon funds for the purpose being appropriated, budgeted and otherwise available. The awarded agreement will automatically terminate on January 1<sup>st</sup> of the first fiscal year for which funds are not appropriated. The County shall give the Contractor written notice of such non-appropriation.
- 36. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY: El Paso County intends and expects that the contracting processes of the County and its Contractors provide equal opportunity without regard to gender, race, creed, ethnicity, religion, age, sex, national origin, or disability and that its Contractors make available equal opportunities to the extent third parties are engaged to provide goods and services to the County as subcontractors, contractors, or otherwise. Accordingly, the Contractor shall not discriminate on any of the foregoing grounds in the performance of the contract and shall make available equal opportunities to the extent third parties are engaged to provide goods and services in connection with performance of the contract (joint ventures are engaged). The Contractor shall disseminate information regarding all subcontracting opportunities under this contract in a manner reasonably calculated to reach all qualified potential subcontractors who may be interested. The Contractor shall maintain records demonstrating its compliance with this article and shall make such records available to the County upon the County's request.
- **37. PURCHASE BY OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES:** Each governmental unit which avails itself of this Solicitation will establish its own contact, place its own orders, issue its own purchase orders, be invoiced there from, and make its own payments and issue its own exemption certifications as required by the Contractor. It is understood and agreed that El Paso County is not a legally binding party to any contractual agreement made between any other governmental unit and the Contractor as a result of this Solicitation.
- **38. CONFIDENTIALITY:** Responses to this Solicitation are considered to be working documents while they are under consideration and, as such, are not subject to official bid openings. The only information released at the public opening of Request for Proposals, Request for Qualifications or Request for Quotes that are not cost driven, will be the names of the respondents. Only after staff makes an official recommendation of award and a contract is fully executed will Responses to this Solicitation be available as public record.

In consideration of Invitation for Bids or for Request for Quotes that are cost driven, the only information that will be released is the names of the respondents, the total cost of the bids, and the apparent responsible, responsive contractor. Only after staff makes an official recommendation of award and a contract is fully executed will Responses to this Bid be available as public record.

Responses submitted to the County for consideration shall be subject to the Colorado Open Records Law, Section 24-72-201, et seq., C.R.S., after award is made. Any confidential information in the Contractor's Response shall be identified as such. Should the County receive a request for the release of any information in the Contractor's Response identified as confidential in accordance with the open records law, the County will notify the Contractor of the request and will exercise best efforts in assisting the Contractor in taking all legally available steps to resist or narrow such request. If, in the opinion of County's legal counsel, the County is nonetheless compelled to disclose any portion of such information to anyone or else stand liable for contempt or suffer censure or penalty, the County may disclose such information without liability.

**39. GRATUITIES AND KICKBACKS:** It shall be a breach of ethical standards for any person to offer, give, or agree to give any employee or former employee (within six months of termination from County employment), or for any employee or former employee (within six months of termination from County employment) to solicit, demand, accept, or agree to accept from another person, a gratuity or an offer of employment in connection with any decision, approval, disapproval, recommendation, preparation of any part of a program requirement or a purchase request, influencing the content of any specification or procurement standard, rendering of advice, investigation, auditing, or in any other advisory capacity in any proceeding of application, request for ruling, determination, claim or controversy, or other particular matter, pertaining to any program requirement or a contract or subcontract, or to any solicitation or proposal therefore.

It shall be a breach of ethical standards for any payment, gratuity, or offer of employment to be made by or on behalf of a subcontractor under a contract to the prime contractor or higher tier subcontractor or any person associated therewith, as an inducement for the award of a subcontract or order. In the event that any gratuities or kickbacks are offered or tendered to any El Paso County employee, the proposal shall be disqualified and shall not be reinstated.

DEBARMENT:** By submitting this Response, the Contractor warrants and certifies that they are eligible to submit a Response because they are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in a transaction by any Federal, State, or local department or agency.

## 1. SPECIFICATIONS

El Paso County Parks is seeking qualified and experienced Contractor(s) for forestry management services at Homestead Ranch Regional Park, 16444 Gollihar Rd, 80831. Initial management efforts will focus on an approximately 37-acre parcel located on the southwest side of the park.

## A. Background

Homestead Ranch Regional Park is dominated by ponderosa pine forest and open grasslands susceptible to high intensity wildfire. Mechanical ponderosa pine restoration is an attainable and worthwhile goal. Emphasis should be to reduce basal area, leaving a mosaic of tree clumps, with openings between clumps and retaining large trees ≥16" DBH to promote old-growth characteristics. Primary efforts will be cutting and removing density-dependent mortality trees which die as a result of other (usually larger) trees being able to out-compete them for light, water, and nutrients. Efforts will also include a reduction in overtopped trees with crowns entirely below the general level of crown cover and receiving no direct light from above or from the sides while increasing space between trees by removing suppressed, overtopped, and intermediate trees.

## B. Objective

Improved forest health, vigor, and fire resistance by selective thinning, fuel load reduction, removal of ladder fuels, dwarf mistletoe mitigation, and creating site conditions that provide better light, nutrients, and moisture. Management activities should create a clumpy mosaic structure on the landscape that has openings, thinned forest, clumpy forest, open grassy forest, and dense forest. As a whole these variations provide the necessary diversity for forest health, wildlife habitat, and wildfire reduction. Example below of current, unhealthy forest conditions.

## 3. SCOPE OF WORK

## A. Contractor Responsibilities

- Contractor shall identify a project manager who will work directly for and support the County project manager in the management and administration of the project. The contractor's project manager shall be responsive daily, Monday through Friday, to the County project manager throughout the project.
- Contractor shall coordinate weekly status meetings with County representatives onsite or at a mutually agreed location.

- Contractor shall maintain a detailed work schedule addressing progress at all work locations. Start and completion dates shall be provided.
- Contractor shall be responsible for locating all utilities in the field prior to commencement of work activities.

## B. Equipment

- Contractor shall provide a list of equipment for County review. Extreme care should be taken to minimize disturbance of soil and understory vegetation.
- Contractor shall have a fire extinguisher always onsite. All equipment leaks (hydraulic oil, antifreeze, fuel, etc.) shall be properly removed and immediately disposed of.
- Contractor shall be responsible for identifying and securing any equipment and project work staging area(s).
- Staging areas shall be in the working areas, or on existing hard surfaces, such as gravel parking lots. Any equipment and material staging and storage areas, must be approved by the County Project Manager prior to forestry activities.
- All staging and storage areas must be identified and secured with stormwater and erosion control BMP's. Extreme care should be taken to use light weight vehicles to minimize disturbances to soil. Use of skid steer loaders, chippers, and masticator is limited to tracked units. Use of brush hog or masticator is prohibited along trail corridors unless specifically approved by the County.

## C. Access Routes - primary access will be gained from the trail corridor

- Secondary access routes shall be identified by the Contractor and provided in the forestry work plan. The secondary access routes identified shall be used during performance of these services.
- Access routes shall avoid sensitive plant communities, wet areas, steep areas, and aspen trees. Access routes shall be maintained to prevent soil disturbance. Skidding of material is prohibited. Contractor access is prohibited during saturated conditions.
- Contractor shall restore any access, staging, or other disturbed area to a pre- existing condition by reseeding with native plant varieties.
- Great care must be taken to avoid user conflict while working along trail corridors. Signs shall be placed in multiple areas along the trail system to alert park guest of work being performed. A spotter is recommended when working within 100ft of a trail corridor. Wood chips must not be broadcast in the direction of the trail corridor.

## D. Project Management

- Thin from below: The removal of trees from the lower crown classes to favor those in the upper crown classes. Thinning from below work focuses on removing trees and shrubs from understory to decrease basal area and reduce ladder fuels. All stumps will be flush cut if possible; no more than four (4) inches in height from any angle. Trunk separation of ≥17' preferred where applicable.
- Thin from above: The removal of trees from the dominant and co-dominant crown classes in order to favor the best trees from these crown classes. Crown separation of ≥ 10 feet is preferred where applicable.
- Tree thinning: The removal of trees to control spacing and favor desired trees, using a combination of thinning criteria without regard to crown portion. Often utilized to gain product during thinning and cutting operations while also promoting age diversity on the landscape. Unhealthy trees or trees with poor form shall be targeted while free thinning.
- Sanitation Cutting: The removal of trees to improve health by stopping or reducing the actual or anticipated spread of insects and disease. Removal of dead trees can be considered sanitation if the goal is to open up new growing space or protect understory growth.
- Pruning: The removal of live or dead side branches (ladder fuels) to decrease fire hazard or improve growth and form. Pruning and raising canopy ≥ 10 feet is required. Reduction of ladder fuels will help prevent ground level flames from reaching the forest canopy.

- Patch Cuts/ Overstory Removal: The complete removal of overstory vegetation to facilitate the growth of advanced regeneration or to allow a forest to naturally regenerate. Patch Cuts differ from Clear Cuts since they are smaller and more focused on ecosystem management rather than forest products.
- Site Preparation: Creating a site that provides better light, nutrients, and moisture to making conditions more favorable for germination, survival, and growth of future forests. Actions can include reducing the competition of unwanted vegetation, removing slash and logging debris if the site has been harvested or burned, or creating microclimates for tree planting.
- Hazard Tree Removal: All hazard trees near active use areas (trails) shall be removed. Buffer distance is based on the rule of 1.5 times the height of the trees. Ex: areas where trees are 40 feet in height, a distance of 60 feet from trail center should be treated to remove these dead, dying, and leaning trees.
- Dwarf Mistletoe Abatement: DMT weakens the trees it infects and can make pine trees more susceptible to mountain pine beetle (MPB) activity and mortality in ponderosa pine. While DMT does not typically kill a tree on its own, it predisposes trees to being attacked by other pathogens such as beetles. Areas containing DMT-infected pines should be treated to minimize the spread of DMT and to minimize the threat of MPB. The areas identified for this specific treatment have light to heavy infestations and can be controlled through pruning infected branches on trees with < 50% infection and complete tree removal when the tree has > than 50% infection.
- Chipping / Mastication: Average chip size should be no larger than 2 inches. Maximum depth of chips shall be 1 inch. Chips shall be kept on County property. No chips shall be broadcast onto adjacent private properties. Logs can be used for soil erosion control where applicable.
- Contractor shall mark work area with orange flagging and project aerial maps will be provided.
- Contractor shall retain wildlife snags for tree bound animals and roosting; provide at least three (3) snags per acre if applicable.
- Contractor shall retain all dead standing trees with evidence of use as a wildlife tree (nest, cavity) greater than six (6) inches in diameter, not threatening roads, trails, structures, or fences. Remove downed-dead woody material, unless deemed viable for habitat.

Three Thousand Dollars (\$1,093,000) per occurrence), which amounts shall be adjusted by an amount reflecting the percentage change over a four-year period in the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, Consumer Price Index for Denver-Boulder-Greeley, All Items, All Urban Consumers, or its successor index, or any other rights, immunities and protections provided by the Colorado Governmental Immunity Act, C.R.S. § 24-10-101, *et seq.*, as from time to time amended, or otherwise available to the County, its officers or employees.

**El Paso County must be included on the General Liability insurance as an additional insured.** Certificates of Insurance must be submitted before commencing work and provide 30 days' notice prior to any cancellation.

It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to ensure that all sub-Contractors carry insurance of not less than those coverages and limits specified herein. Proper evidence of this compliance must be forwarded to appropriate department prior to the inception of any work by sub-Contractor.

If your tax records are not currently affected by identity theft but you think you are at risk due to a lost or stolen purse or wallet, questionable credit card activity or credit report, contact the IRS Identity Theft Hotline at 1-800-908-4490 or submit Form 14039.

Victims of identity theft who are experiencing economic harm or a system problem, or are seeking help in resolving tax problems that have not been resolved through normal channels, may be eligible for Taxpayer Advocate Service (TAS) assistance. Protect yourself from suspicious emails or phishing schemes. Phishing is the creation and use of email and websites designed to mimic legitimate business emails and websites. The most common act is sending an email to a user falsely claiming to be an established legitimate enterprise in an attempt to scam the user into surrendering private information that will be used for identity theft.

The IRS does not initiate contacts with taxpayers via emails. Also, the IRS does not request personal detailed information through email or ask taxpayers for the PIN numbers, passwords, or similar secret access information for their credit card, bank, or other financial accounts.
