The Colorado Works program (Colorado's Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program) is an employment program that supports families with dependent children on their path to self-sufficiency.

Clients can receive cash assistance, schooling, workforce development and skills training.

The program is available throughout the state and is managed locally by each county.




Case managers help clients with skills, schooling and training.




Clients are matched to a case manager.

COLORADO WORKS PROGRAM FACTS

- There is a five-year (60-months) time limit.
- Clients are accountable to meet work requirements.
- To qualify, clients typically need to have income below half the poverty line. Cash assistance reaches fewer than one in three poor families nation wide.
- All cases are treated with compassionate, trauma-informed care.
- The program utilizes a multigenerational approach, meaning it addresses the needs of the whole family.
- Clients are connected to public education programs and are willing to learn.
- Clients participate in public job-readiness programs and are connected with local workforce centers.
