MINUTES

July 15th, 2026

Board Members: Chantel Bruce, Judge Amanda Philipps, Judge Cynthia McKedy, Brent Nelson, Deana O'Riley, Lt. Dave Gilman, Lt. Mower, Lorena Gray, LeeAnn Ortega, Ryan Graham, Jerry Jones, Michael McNeill, and Taylor Kallian.

Staff present: Vernon Stewart, McCain Hildebrand, Daniel Huddleston, Tiffany Weaver, Cassidy Keltner-Lecce, and Mark Allison.

Guests present: Steve Owens, Gwen Barlow, Mark Wester, Jenner Behan, and Terry Sample.

1. **Chantel Bruce called the meeting to order at 12:15 p.m.** The Board meeting was held with members attending virtually or in person.

2. **Attendance:** Chantel Bruce called roll.

3. **Case Review:**

a. **VRA Statements:** Statements provided by victims or victim representatives.

b. **Discussion and Balloting:** No Discussion. Balloting was opened.

4. **Approval of Minutes and Presentation:**

a. **Brent Nelson moved, and Lt. Mower seconded the ratification of the meeting minutes for June 17th and the electronic meeting minutes for June 3rd, 10th, and 24th, 2026; the motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.**

5. **Program Reports:**

a. **Embrace (ECC):** Mark Wester reported for Embrace; he reported that their residential average daily census in June was 245 with 253 beds allocated by DCJ; that the child support collected was \$2,614.22, and restitution collected was \$7,570.65; he reported that Embrace had 45 admissions with 42 residential terminations during June; that the successful completion rate was 66.7%, totaling 28; that the negative terminations were 33.3%, totaling 14; he reported that the negative terminations included 19% for escapes, totaling eight, and 14.3% for technical violations, totaling six.

Mr. Wester reported that in June, Embrace received 18 Diversion and 74 Transition referrals; he reported that Embrace accepted seven auto Diversion referrals and three criteria Diversion referrals, as well as nine auto Transition referrals and 45 criteria Transition referrals.

Mr. Wester reported that current staff vacancies include nine security positions, two case management positions, two treatment staff positions, two support staff, and two admin positions; Mr. Wester reported that the current client employment rate is 75.22%, and that the positive UA rate for the month is 2.3%; he reported that Embrace imposed 93 client sanctions and had 10 medical emergencies in June, along with receiving six client grievances.

He reported that Embrace had DOC SOMB training, and that they had a culture survey done with DCJ, along with an assessment on behavioral intervention practices.

Mark Wester reported on Embrace's KPI's; that their current 90-day turnover rate is at 37%, with the goal of a 40% or lower 90-day turnover rate; that they have a current turnover rate of 27%, with the goal to conduct on the job training to improve staff retention; that their current baseline of unauthorized absences is 146, with the goal to decrease annualized unauthorized absences by 5%; that through the second quarter, Embrace had 12 escapes in the first 15 days, with the goal to reduce unauthorized absences of the first 15 days of clients by 5%.

- b. **Community Alternatives of El Paso (CAE)**: Steve Owens reported for CAE; he reported that the bed count for June was 229, with 243 allocated by the Division of Criminal Justice (DCJ); that the total child support collected was \$3,050.58 and restitution was \$10,014.17; that there were 49 admissions and 51 terminations in June; that 27 clients successfully finished the program in June, yielding a successful program completion rate of 52.9%; that negative terminations numbered 24, yielding a negative termination rate of 47.1%, including 27.5% terminations for escapes, numbering 14, 2% terminations for Committed New Crime, numbering one, and 15.7% terminations for house/technical violations, numbering eight; Mr. Owens stated that the June client employment rate was 84.1%, and that the positive UA rate for the month was 5.2%; that CAE imposed 12 client sanctions in June; that there were two client grievances and five medical emergencies; he reported that the current staff vacancies include six security, and two Case Management positions. Mr. Owens reported 65 Diversion and 49 Transition referrals in June; he reported that CAE accepted 15 Diversion auto referrals and 40 Diversion criteria referrals; they accepted four Transition auto referrals, and 31 Transition criteria referrals.

Mr. Owens reported that in June CAE had another Communities of Practice (COP) for security and case management staff.

6. Monthly Reports:

- a. **SFY25 Financial Report**: McCain Hildebrand reported that for June 2026, expenditures were expected to be at 100%; that Embrace was at \$7,200,211.78 expended, representing 7.43% overspent; that CAE was at \$6,565,055.80 expended, representing 2.05% underspent.

- b. **Provider Termination Report:** MaCain Hildebrand reported that for June 2026, Community Alternatives of El Paso County had a 54% positive/successful termination rate, an unauthorized absence termination rate of 28%, a new crime termination rate of 2%, and a 16% technical violation termination rate; he reported that Embrave had a 66.67% positive/successful termination rate, a 19.05% unauthorized absence termination rate, and a 14.29% technical violation termination rate.
- c. **Staff Report:** MaCain Hildebrand reported that Chantel Bruce, Cassidy Keltner-Lecce, and Mark Allison represented El Paso County at the Colorado Association of Community Corrections Boards summer meeting in June; that the 4th Judicial District Community Corrections Authority approved acceptance of the SFY27 Allocation Letter #3 from DPS, the proposed use of allocated funds, and extended the annual contracts with CAE and Embrave for SFY27.

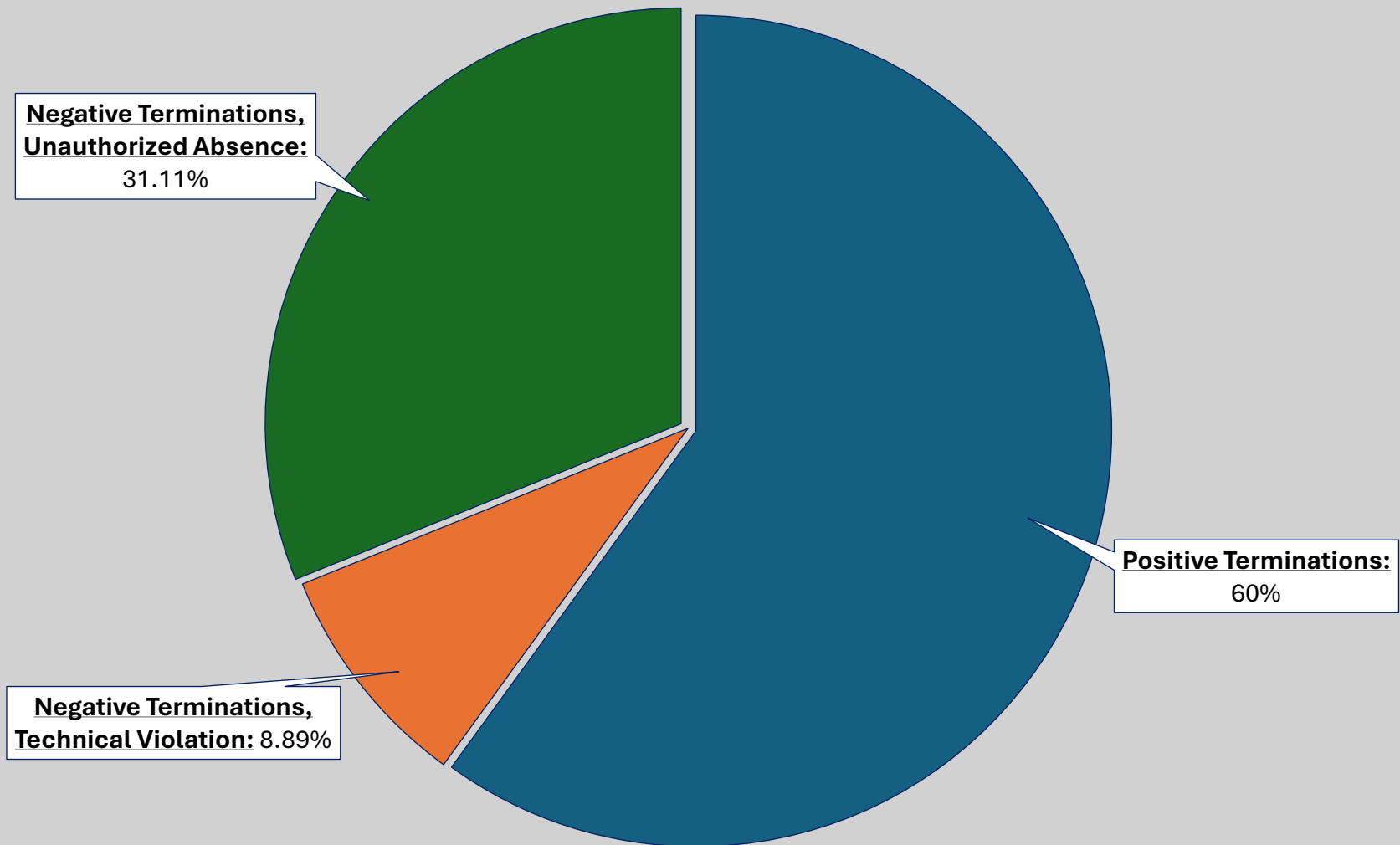

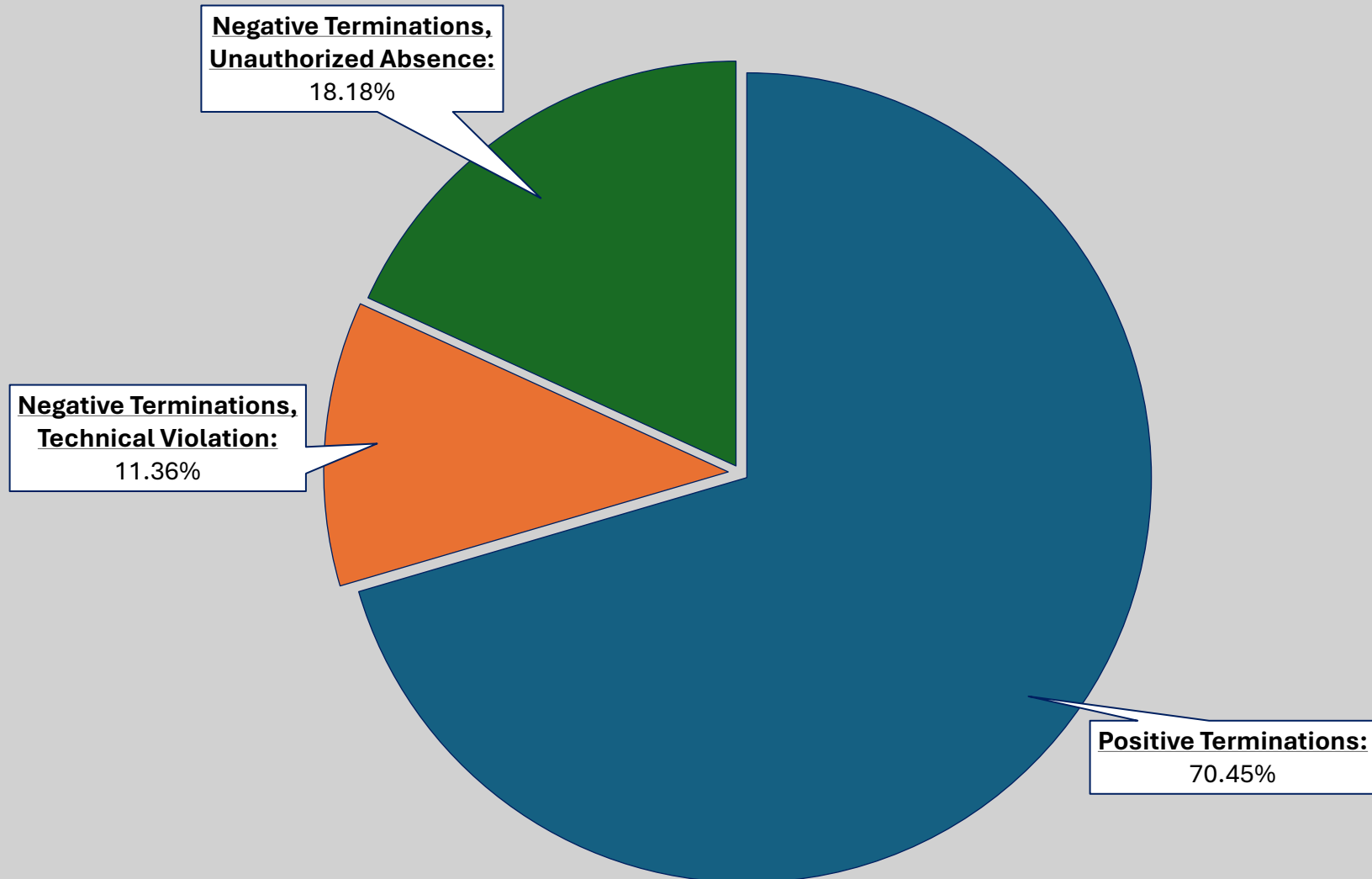

Community Corrections Partners,

Attached you will find a memo from the Department of Corrections with formal notice for Prison Population Management Measures and establishing the requirement to identify transition clients that have been in the program for more than 180 days and providing a list of ISP-I eligible clients.

Senate Bill 26-036 which was passed and signed into statute this past legislative session made updates to the Prison Population Management Measures, as well as other statutes regarding community corrections. With the passing of the bill, the vacancy percentage was increased to 4% and a more formal notice structure was established. For the Office of Community Corrections, we continue to be required to send a weekly notification to DOC on the utilization of community corrections beds. In addition to this, our office is also now required to investigate the possibility of expanding capacity for the transition population in community corrections while under the measures.

In regards to our partnership with DOC, as part of the expanded measures, community corrections providers are required to review each transition client that has been in the program for more than 180 days for eligibility of ISP-I. Each program must provide a list of eligible clients for ISP-I who have employment and housing options. The language reads:

“REQUEST, IN WRITING, THAT EACH COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PROVIDER REVIEW THE STATUTORY CRITERIA FOR EACH TRANSITION INMATE WHO HAS RESIDED IN THE COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PROGRAM OPERATED BY THE PROVIDER FOR MORE THAN ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY DAYS AND WHO MEETS THE PROGRAM OBJECTIVES FOR AN INTENSIVE SUPERVISION PROGRAM PURSUANT TO SECTION 17-27.5-101, AND PROVIDE THE DEPARTMENT WITH A LIST OF INTENSIVE SUPERVISION PROGRAM-ELIGIBLE TRANSITION INMATES WITH EMPLOYMENT AND HOUSING OPTIONS. AFTER RECEIVING THE LIST OF TRANSITION INMATES, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL INVESTIGATE AND APPROVE A RESIDENCE PLAN FOR EACH TRANSITION INMATE ON THE LIST AND SUBMIT PAGE 4-SENATE BILL 26-036 THE APPROVED RESIDENCE PLAN TO THE RELEVANT COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS BOARD. “

The attached memo serves as the written notice, and DOC and our office are requesting that you **provide the required list to the OCC by August 24, 2026**. Lists can be emailed directly to myself at katie.ruske@state.co.us. The OCC will collect all lists and distribute them to the DOC for the next steps.

The memo also establishes the requirement that all community corrections partners must acknowledge receipt of the notification of Prison Population Management Measure. Please see and follow the instructions in the attached memo for completing this formal acknowledgement.

In addition to this requirement, we would like to make all community corrections partners aware that the bill changed the timelines for eligibility for ISP-I for clients who successfully complete community corrections. Clients who successfully complete community corrections no longer need to be within 180 days of their Parole Eligibility Date.

As of July 18, 2025, the tracked prison bed vacancy rate dropped below the three percent (3%) statutory threshold identified in C.R.S. § 17-1-119 the CDOC has remained under active Prison Population Management Measures (PPMM) since that date. Pursuant to Senate Bill 26-036, which designates your office as a recipient of these reports, please accept this correspondence as the required formal notification.

Pursuant to C.R.S. § 17-1-119.7(2)(a)(I)(B), community corrections providers are hereby requested to:

- Review the statutory criteria for each transition inmate who has resided in the provider's community corrections program for more than 180 days and who meets program objectives for an Intensive Supervision Program (ISP) pursuant to C.R.S. § 17-27.5-101.
- Provide CDOC with a list of all ISP eligible transition inmates, including verified employment and housing options for each individual.
