1. Chantel Bruce called the meeting to order at 12:15 p.m. The Board meeting was held with members attending virtually or in person.

2. Attendance: Chantel Bruce called roll.

3. Case Review:

- a. VRA Statements: Statements provided by victims or victim representatives for offenders.
- b. Discussion and Balloting: No Discussion. Balloting was opened.

4. Approval of Minutes and Presentation:

a. Colleen Layman moved, and Lt. Derek Mower seconded ratifying the meeting minutes for June 18th and the electronic meeting minutes from 4th, 11th & 25th, 2025; the motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.

5. Program Reports:

a. Embrave (ECC): Mark Wester reported for Embrave; he reported that their residential average daily census in June was 285 with 234 beds allocated by DCJ; that the child support collected was \$6,057.00, and restitution collected was \$12,300.00; he reported that Embrave had 68 admissions with 44 residential terminations during June; that the successful completion rate was 72.7%, totaling 32; that the negative terminations were 27.3%, totaling 12; the negative terminations included 18.2% for escapes, totaling eight; and 9.1% for technical violations, totaling four.

Mr. Wester reported that Embrave received 51 Diversion and 63 Transition referrals in June; he reported that Embrave accepted 100% of auto Diversion referrals and 78% of criteria Diversion referrals, as well as 100% of auto Transition referrals and 85% of criteria Transition referrals.

Mr. Wester reported that current staff vacancies include one security position, four case manager positions, one Admin position, and one support staff position; Mr. Wester reported that the current client employment rate is 67.50%, and that the positive UA rate for the month is 3.8%; he reported that Embrave imposed 127 client sanctions in June; that there were seven medical emergencies during June; he reported that there were four grievances.

Mark Wester reported on Embrave's KPI's; specifically, that the Q2 involuntary staff turnover rate was 11%; that the average length of stay for staff members was 4.4 years; that six unique kinds of staff training had been offered so far this year; and that overall satisfaction with course offerings/trainings was 90% with 10% neutral voting.

Mr. Wester reported that Embrave conducted Victim Rights Act training for all staff, detailing how to notify victims; he reported that Parole recently conducted a search of the 3615 Roberts Road facility.

b. Community Alternatives of El Paso (CAE): Evan Burton reported for CAE; he reported that their current bed count is 231, with 235 allocated by the Division of Criminal Justice (DCJ); that the total child support collected was \$3,420.00 and restitution was \$18,460.26; that there were 37 admissions and 35 terminations in June; that the successful program completion rate was 54.3%; and that the negative termination rate was 45.7%, which included seven escapes and nine technical/house violations; he reported that there were three medical emergency incidents and 18 client sanctions imposed; he reported that the current staff vacancies include four security positions and two case management positions.

Mr. Burton reported 45 Diversion and 34 Transition referrals in June; he reported that CAE accepted 92.3% of Diversion auto referrals, and 87.5% of Diversion criteria referrals; that CAE accepted 100% of both Transition auto referrals and Transition criteria referrals in June; that in June, CAE's client employment rate was 81.7% and their UA positivity rate was 4.8%.

Evan Burton reported that in June, CAE's Assistant Director, Programs Manager, and four case managers attended SOAR training and Case Planning that was provided by CoreCivic. He stated that in June, two clients graduated from the IRT program and that to date, the program has graduated a total of 34 clients.

Mr. Burton then spoke to the Board about the Bridge support group, and the board was addressed by Rick Dryer and Gino Aviles, who help to run the Convergent 7 Habits programs at CAE.

The newly instated director of CAE, Mr. Steve Owens, addressed the board and spoke about his new role.

6. Monthly Reports:

- a. <u>SFY24 Financial Report</u>: MaCain Hildebrand reported that the June 2025 expenditures were expected to be at 100%; that Embrave was at \$6,971,953.06 expended, representing 4.03% overspent; and that CAE was at \$6,448,716.29 expended, representing 2.31% underspent.
- b. **Provider Termination Report**: MaCain Hildebrand reported that for May 2025, Community Alternatives of El Paso County had a 54.29% positive/successful termination rate, a 20% unauthorized absence termination rate, and a 25.71% technical violation termination rate; he reported that Embrave had a 72.73% positive/successful termination rate, a 18.18% unauthorized absence termination rate, and a 9.09% technical violation termination rate; Board members asked questions about how many times a client can have technical violations before being terminated; Jenner Behan provided clarification to the Board on this matter, specifically regarding the review process related to individual behaviors and violations.
- c. Staff Report: MaCain Hildebrand reported that three CDOC case managers from the Canon Minimum Centers (CMC) cross-trained with our community corrections board staff on June 24th; that the completed DCJ Community Corrections Financial report required by SB23-242 has been included with the agenda for board member review; that board staff are participating in the CAE PACE audit this week; and that at the request of the board, a presentation on tracked data regarding community corrections absconder totals and known outcomes will be presented during the August 20, 2025 Board Meeting; the board was informed that there will be a recovery court graduation for those interested in attending on July 17th 2025.





Background Information:

On June 11, 2025, the El Paso County Community Corrections Board (CCB) rejected the Diversion referral for Carolyn Murray (El Paso County Cases 24CR20, 24CR2497, 25CR1256, 25CR1272)

Following the rejection, Public Defender Monica Uzpen submitted a Request for Reconsideration on behalf of Carolyn Murray on August 8, 2025. Ms. Uzpen cited newly discovered relevant information not available at the time of the original screening, which she contends may have prevented fair consideration. It has been determined that Ms. Uzpen has met the established criteria for the CCB to reconsider the placement of Carolyn Murray. The original Diversion referral for Carolyn Murray for El Paso County cases 24CR20, 24CR2497, 25CR1256, 25CR1272A, along with a copy of Ms. Uzpen's Request for Reconsideration, were provided to all board members in advance of today's meeting for reference and review.

In accordance with current Offender Placement Review Procedures, Reconsideration After Rejection by either Vendor(s) or CCB (not after termination from a program) section E.17, the Board is being asked by an officer of the court to reconsider Carolyn Murray's case.

17. Reconsideration After Rejection by either Vendor(s) or CCB (not after termination from a program)

A CCB member or an officer of the court or the executive branch of government may request that a case be reconsidered subject to the following criteria:

- a. The request must be in writing and directed to the Chair of the CCB through the CCP staff.
- b. The request must be limited to three (3) pages, including exhibits.
- c. The request must cite one or more of the following as its justification:

- 1. An irregularity in the original screening which prevented fair consideration.
- 2. Misconduct on the part of the CCB.
- 3. Newly discovered relevant information not available at the time of the original screening *
 - *If a psychological evaluation is to be considered, it must be included with the original referral packet and shall not be the sole basis for reconsideration; or
- 4. An error in applying CCB written criteria.

As per our current Offender Placement Review Procedures, Section E 17. e.

- 2. If the CCB unanimously agrees to reconsider the placement, the procedures for offender placement review will be implemented.
- 3. If reconsideration does not receive unanimous approval, the original action of the CCB shall stand.

If approved for reconsideration, an updated Diversion Referral application for Client Murray would be obtained and placed on the next ballot for the board to review.

The board is being asked to determine if Client Carolyn Murray should be reconsidered for community corrections placement.

I am writing on behalf of my client, who was recently rejected from Community Corrections, to request that reconsideration be given in her case pursuant to E. 17(c)(3). This section allows for a vote for reconsideration in situations where there is "newly discovered relevant information not available at the time of the original screening". Specifically, this board rejected from Community Corrections citing that there had been a previous failure when had been sentenced to Embrave. On April 16th, 2024 was sentenced to Embrave for a period of two years, with a stay of execution given to her for April 18th at 2 pm. Unfortunately, was unable to go to Community Corrections due to an involuntary 72 hour civil commitment hold beginning on April 17th 2024. On April 18th of 2024, was still subject to that hold. On April 24th, a rejection after acceptance was filed citing that requirement that the request and accompanying exhibits do not exceed 3 pages, I was unable to attach documentation supporting the latter portion, but will be happy to supplement this to the board upon request. This information only just came to my attention as
brain injury that impairs her memory. After beginning the screening process, she recalled that she had been granted a community corrections sentence in the past but that she had been unable to attend due to the involuntary hold. I have attached appropriate documentation of this hold for the board to review, which I believe was unavailable at the time of the initial screening. In my few months of representing I have come to know her as someone who
has managed to overcome a lot of her own mental health struggles and find stability through her current relationship and opportunities afforded to her since that time. She does suffer from a traumatic brain injury that impacts her memory, and at the time of receiving the contemplated offer had completely forgotten that she had ever at a previous time been accepted into Community Corrections. Since that time she has learned how to take notes for herself to aid in her understanding and memory, and has been put on the right balance of medications to assist her in maintaining her mental health.
I believe that is a good candidate for Community Corrections, and hope that the court will re-consider her rejection. Sincerely,

Your rights as provided here may only be denied if access to an item, program, or service would cause you to destabilize or would create a danger to yourself or others. Any such determination must be made by a licensed provider involved in your care. Denial of any right listed here must be entered into your record and must be made available, upon request, to you, your legal guardian, and/or your attorney.

** If you feel at any time your rights have been violated, you have the right to file a complaint against the facility with the Behavioral Health Administration and/or the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment. Your patient representative will assist you in making a formal complaint or grievance if requested. **

- 1. **REASON FOR DETAINMENT**. You have the right to be told the reason for your detainment and the limitations of that detainment. You have the right to not be detained in a jail, lockup, or other place used for confinement of persons charged with or convicted of penal offenses.
- 2. **INFORMED.** You will be told the reason for any holding at a facility and the limits of this holding. You will be evaluated to decide your mental health condition and find the best direction for your care. You have the right to receive care that is provided safely, by a skilled professional, that will treat you humanely.

There is potential for your hold to end before 72 hours or extended longer than 72 hours depending on your specific needs.

- 3. **TELEPHONES**. You have the right to have reasonable access to telephones or other communication devices. You have the right to make and receive calls or communications in private. You have the right to keep and use your cellphone, unless access to your cellphone causes you to destabilize or will result in danger to yourself or others as determined by a provider, facility staff member, or security personnel involved in your care.
- 4. **CLOTHING AND POSSESSIONS.** You have the right to wear your own clothing, to keep and use your personal possessions, and to keep and be allowed to spend a reasonable sum of your own money. The facility may temporarily restrict your access to personal clothing or possessions until a safety assessment is completed. A licensed medical or behavioral health professional must conduct a safety assessment as soon as possible. If the facility restricts your access to personal clothing or personal possessions, the facility is required to inform you as to why these things are being restricted. The facility shall periodically conduct additional safety assessments to determine whether you may possess your personal clothing and possessions, with the goal of restoring your rights.
- 5. YOUR ATTORNEY. You have the right to retain and consult with an attorney at any time. If you are being detained by an emergency medical services facility under a subsequent emergency mental health hold, the facility must notify the court and the court shall appoint an attorney to represent you. Non-emergency medical services facilities are not required to retain an attorney on your behalf, but they must

. Patient:

- allow you to contact an attorney. You must have access to your attorney at any time, including but not limited to, during non-visiting hours. The facility must not deny any request to speak with your attorney.
- PATIENT REPRESENTATIVE. Within 24 hours of making a request, you have the right to see and
 receive the services of a patient representative who has no direct or indirect clinical, administrative, or
 financial responsibility for you.
- MEDICATIONS. You have the right to refuse medications. Any treatments offered during your emergency mental health hold require your consent. This does not include the use of emergency medications.
- 8. VOLUNTARY EVALUATION. You have the right to request a change in legal status. You may request to receive an evaluation of your treatment and care needs on a voluntary basis. If you do not feel that you are able to truly make a voluntary decision, you may continue to be held involuntarily.
- 9. NO DISCRIMINATION. You have the right to the same consideration and treatment as anyone else regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, culture, spoken language, age, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, socioeconomic status, or physical or mental disability. You have the right to be treated fairly, with respect and recognition of your dignity and individuality by all employees of the facility with whom you come into contact.
- 10. BASIC NEEDS. You have the right to appropriate access to water, hygiene products, and food. You have the right to have your nutritional needs met in a manner that is consistent with recognized dietary practices.
- 11. **VISITORS**. You have the right to have frequent and convenient opportunities to meet with visitors in accordance with the facility's current visitor guidelines. You have the right to see your attorney, chosen clergyperson, or physician at any time.
- 12. **RELIGIOUS PRACTICES**. You have the right to continue to practice your religion while on a mental health hold.
- CONFIDENTIALITY. You have the right to have your records remain confidential, except as required by law.
- 14. FINGERPRINTS AND PHOTOGRAPHS. You have the right not to be fingerprinted except as required by law. You have the right not to be photographed, except upon admission to the facility for purposes for identification and administration. Any photographs taken by the facility are confidential and must not be released except pursuant to court order. Any nonmedical photographs may not be taken or used without appropriate consent or authorization.
- 15. RECORDS. You have the right to have your information and records disclosed to family members and lay persons as chosen by you. However, if you are a ward or conservatee, your guardian may designate to whom your records or information may be disclosed.
